FIRST, print petitions from our websites (i.e., www.CaliforniaHumanRightsAmendment.com or www.CivilRightsFoundation.org), making sure that the entire document fits on one 8½ x 14 legal-sized page, then follow the steps below.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE COMPLETED IN BLUE OR BLACK INK!

- STEP 1** Fill in the name of the **County** where you live.
- STEP 2** Clearly print your name and address and sign your signature in Box 1.**
- STEP 3** Have a friend or relative in the same **County** fill in Box 2.
Have another friend or relative in the same **County** fill in Box 3
- STEP 4** Fill Out the Declaration of Circulator Box Blanks.
First blank – Print your name. **Second** blank – Print your County.
Third blank – Print your address. **Fourth** blank – Print the start date.
Fifth blank – Print the end date. **Sixth** blank – Print the current date.
Seventh blank – Print your County.
- STEP 5** Sign your name as the Circulator of the Petition(s) you circulate.**

INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO VOTERS

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purposes and points of the proposed measure:

CHANGES CONSTITUTIONAL DEFINITION OF A PERSON TO INCLUDE FERTILIZED HUMAN EGGS. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. Extends constitutional protections of due process and equal protection to all fertilized human eggs by redefining "person" as including each and every human organism from the commencement of biological development. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government: Potential increased costs for courts, law enforcement, and other agencies for criminal and civil proceedings. Potential costs and savings for health and social services programs if the courts determined that the measure restricts access to some types of birth control methods. Potential loss of state or local revenues due to reduced research activity that may be offset by reduced state spending on research. Unknown potential effects on state and local health care expenditures due to changes that may occur in medical practices. (09-0043.)

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CALIFORNIA: We the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of the County (or City and County) described below, hereby propose an amendment to the Constitution of the State of California relating to definition of a person to include fertilized human eggs, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to the general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed constitutional amendment reads as follows:

SECTION 1. Title
This measure shall be known and may be cited as the "California Human Rights Amendment."

SECTION 2. Article I, Section 7 (c) is added to the California Constitution. **Article I, Section 7** will now read in its entirety (note subsection (c) in boldface type):

§ 7. Due process; Equal protection; Privileges and immunities

(a) A person may not be deprived of life, liberty, or property without due process of law or denied equal protection of the laws; provided, that nothing contained herein or elsewhere in this Constitution imposes upon the State of California or any public entity, board, or official any obligations or responsibilities which exceed those imposed by the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution with respect to the use of pupil school assignment or pupil transportation. In enforcing this subdivision or any other provision of this Constitution, no court of this state may impose upon the State of California or any public entity, board, or official any obligation or responsibility with respect to the use of pupil school assignment or pupil transportation, (1) except to remedy a specific violation by such party that would also constitute a violation of the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th

Amendment to the United States Constitution, and (2) unless a federal court would be permitted under federal decisional law to impose that obligation or responsibility upon such party to remedy the specific violation of the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th amendment of the United States Constitution.

Except as may be precluded by the Constitution of the United States, every existing judgment, decree, writ, or other order of a court of this state, whenever rendered, which includes provisions regarding pupil school assignment or pupil transportation, or which requires a plan including any such provisions shall, upon application to a court having jurisdiction by any interested person, be modified to conform to the provisions of this subdivision as amended, as applied to the facts which exist at the time of such modification.

In all actions or proceedings arising under or seeking application of the amendments to this subdivision proposed by the Legislature at its 1979-80 Regular Session, all courts, wherein such actions or proceedings are or may hereafter be pending, shall give such actions or proceedings first precedence over all other civil actions therein.

Nothing herein shall prohibit the governing board of a school district from voluntarily continuing or

commencing a school integration plan after the effective date of this subdivision as amended.

In amending this subdivision, the Legislature and people of the State of California find and declare that this amendment is necessary to serve compelling public interests, including those of making the most effective use of the limited financial resources now and prospectively available to support public education, maximizing the educational opportunities and protecting the health and safety of all public school pupils, enhancing the ability of parents to participate in the educational process, preserving harmony and tranquility in this state and its public schools, preventing the waste of scarce fuel resources, and protecting the environment.

(b) A citizen or class of citizens may not be granted privileges or immunities not granted on the same terms to all citizens. Privileges or immunities granted by the Legislature may be altered or revoked.

(c) For the purpose of this section: The term "person" applies to all living human organisms from the beginning of their biological development — regardless of the means by which they were procreated, method of reproduction, age, race, sex, gender, physical well-being, function, or condition of physical or mental dependency and/or disability.
